Work Related Learning


As part of our Work Related Learning program, we have been working together with Renishaw PLC, an engineering company who design and produce products for transport, medical, electronic and motorsport industries using the latest technology, including 3D printing. Students will have the chance to visit and take a tour of the factory and see some of the technical equipment they design, make and use every day. Students will also have the chance to take part in an engineering workshop where they will make their own torch to take away.



Also on the calendar for students is the Production Futures Event, taking place on Weds 8th March, an event where students can learn about careers in areas such as Music, TV, Film and Broadcast ing, Theatre and E-Sports. Students will get the chance to speak to employers and professionals from the media production industry and find out more about careers

Year 10 continue to enjoy an organic learning approach and Donte has thoroughly enjoyed his curiosity led lessons.


Kian and Brandon have shown an interest in learning about the solar system, so we set up a mock solar system on the field to show the relative sizes and distance between some of the objects in our solar system.
