As we approach the Summer examinations, our KS4 students are busy preparing for Functional Skills and GCSE exams. In Maths lessons our students have been cracking through the syllabus, with Year 11s working hard in preparation for the GCSE summer examinations series. All of our active year 11s have either successfully completed an Entry Level 3 qualification for Maths or are taking their GCSE in Maths. We have 3 students taking the higher GCSE and we have 11 students taking foundation GCSE.

Year 9 have just completed their first end-of-module assessment on algebra and have just started looking at a new geometry topic - Angles in Polygons.





In English lessons students have been developing speaking and listening skills for both Functional Skills and GCSE exams. Assessment involves each student talking about an area of personal interest. This is not always an easy task, yet all students achieved a Functional Skills or GCSE level pass. Topics have included Cyber security, the band Korn, military history and football, to name just a few.

Spoken language skills are at the heart of English teaching at Belong Devon, whether students have specific communication needs or not. Being able to express ourselves leads to self-advocacy, and the ability to participate in discussion supports engagement with other people and the world around us; these skills will be strengths for life.

Science

This term we have been gearing up for GCSE Physics and Biology. It has been amazing to see 5 of our students prepare and take GCSE Physics and one of our students prepare and take GCSE biology. The students finished their syllabus at Easter with the Physics students looking at Space and our place in the Universe. In Biology we have been looking at the theory of evolution and inheritance.

Since Easter we have been purely in revision mode. This involved revision of the content from the last two years, doing lots of past exam questions, and going over the required practicals in preparation for the two final papers.

Year 9 students have been studying their overview of science and we have considered such topics as Ecosystems, evolution, the structure of the Earth, Space and more recently completed a module on human reproduction. Trauma Informed and Mental Health Training Belong School Devon

This term, Belong School Devon's Mental Health and Trauma Informed leads Shannon Norman and John Green have continued to offer evening sessions to parents and carers.

In addition to the opportunity for discussion and sharing experiences, John and Shannon offer information on strategies and approaches that can be used to help support young people both inside and outside the school environment.

Shannon and John have produced a Parent Guide to Mental Health and Trauma Informed Practice, with some great examples of strategies that are used in school as part of Belong Learning Relational Practice. Humanities students planned and took part in a trip to Dawlish Warren as part of their preparation for Geography paper 3, and coasts revision in preparation for paper 1. Students created an itinerary for the trip, including train times and buying tickets as part of their ASDAN work.

While there, we looked at coastal landforms created by erosion and deposition and analysed hard and soft engineering methods used to protect sea cliffs and coastlines.

Entry Level History students have worked really hard to ensure that they have completed both papers and the independent task needed for their entry level qualification. Their hard work has now been submitted ready for the results later this summer.
