Belong School Gloucestershire's Pupil
Parliament has gone from strength to
strength this year, with the addition of some
new faces to the team. The students who
make up the Parliament work hard to
represent the views of their peers within the
school on key issues, organise special events
and maximise the positive impacts of the
school within the local community through a
variety of charity and outreach projects.





Most recently the Pupil Parliament organised the school's coronation celebrations. This involved decorating the school and organising an excellent day of British-themed activities. For the day, the hub was expertly transformed with Union flags and British Images, complete with bangers and mash for dinner. Students played darts, table-top football and took part in a really competitive quiz on the new British Monarch. Much fun was had by all and the success came down to the hard work of the Pupil Parliament.



Belong School Gloucestershire students have been working on a number of projects, including working to create an outdoor space for playing football. They measured out the space for the grass to be cut and made a goal post out of Hazel and rope, practicing lashing and learning about balancing as part of the process. We also completed our first landscape gardening project. Using skills from an AQA award we created a Chinese inspired miniature garden, involving selecting plants all originating from China whilst creating a rock feature that includes quartz and green stones, symbolising jade, a spiritual stone from the country. We have also recently branched out to working off-site at our local nature reserve. We created a temporary base camp and have had lessons there as well as learning about nature in our local area. Topics have included mushrooms, the nutrient cycle of trees and edible plants. Our new space offers a relaxing environment that students seem to flourish in.



This term the students have been working on a variety of projects, building on everything we have looked at so far this year. We have some year 11's that have been learning how to screen print and turn their street art stencils into t-shirt designs.

Our year 9's have been learning how to lino cut and created some hammerhead shark prints with Polynesian patterns. We have also been putting our photographs onto canvas and learning to stitch into them in the style of artist Victoria Vilsana. In addition to this and our success with the Arts Award we have been recognised as a Champion Centre by Trinity College. This means we are an ambassador for the award and will be helping to support and inspire other schools working to deliver Trinity College London's Arts Awards.









This term we have been very happy to welcome Katie Kelly, our new Lab Tech/Teacher to the Belong Gloucester Science department.



Katie immediately got stuck in and has created an incredible key stage 3 syllabus and re-organised the preparation room, which now looks immaculate.





In January we kickstarted our new reading program at Belong Gloucester, opening our new library area for students to choose their daily reading books. Students read every day for the first 20 minutes of their day, with staff completing a reading log of their progress. Students have responded positively to reading at the start of each day and we have several success stories. One student requested to bring his own book in to read as he didn't have time to read it at home. Another student started the year with the claim they had never read a book from start to finish before and is currently on his fifth book this year!

Moving forwards, we are kickstarting the reading program in September with a wider variety of reading options, including articles, blogs and magazines alongside our ever-growing book collection.
